

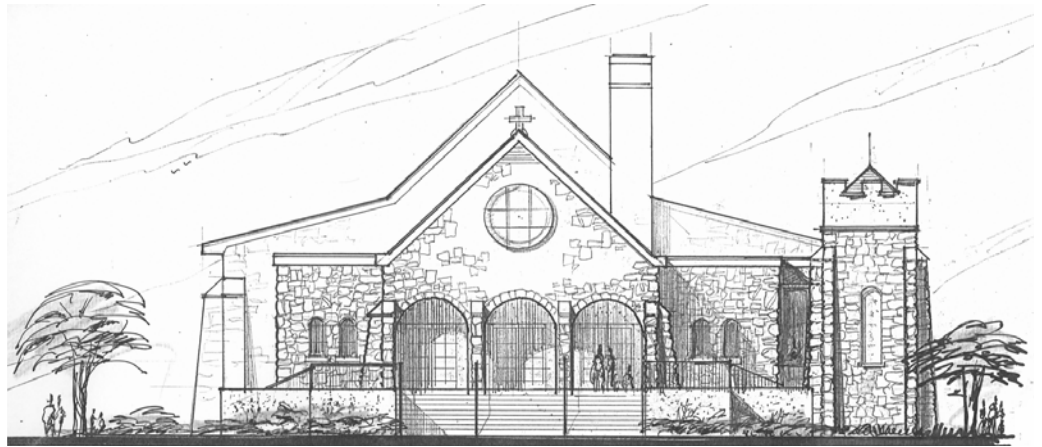
HIS WORD TODAY

**Thirtieth Sunday
in Ordinary Time
October 29, 2017**

“Thus says the Lord: ‘You shall not molest or oppress the alien, for you were once alien yourselves in the land of Egypt. You shall not wrong any widow or orphan. If ever you wrong them and they cry out to me, I will surely hear their cry... If he cries out to me, I will hear him, for I am compassionate.’”

From the earliest pages of the bible, concern for aliens, widows and orphans were a priority. In the Acts of the Apostles, the life of the first Christians, the same vulnerable persons were addressed, leading to the vocation of the first deacons.

Today we seem to overlook the helplessness of refugees, those fleeing war, poverty and famine. How many persons have been forced to leave home, family in search of freedom and humane conditions. Unfortunately they seem only to be a statistic. People do not want to leave their land and their family to live in camps with oppressive heat, little food and unhealthy conditions. They are forced to do so fleeing cartels and gangs. In the United States years ago, they were called DP's, and displaced persons were looking for a welcome and harbor was given to them. As we read the book of Moses today, take a moment to consider the plight of those who are calling out to us. They are the very ones the Lord will listen to, and we are the ones called by Him to answer.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN BURIAL: At such times of deep pain and loss, we seek to offer our bereaved families comfort and hope as they commend their loved ones to God. Please note that, in accordance with Church regulations, eulogies are not permitted during Funeral Masses.

MESSAGE FROM FR. BILL

This past week, we hosted the third part of the Lutheran-Catholic Dialogue. For me, the whole experience was terrific. At our dialogue presentations, I was able to experience the comradery of all the parishioners from St. Denis, Holy Trinity and St. Mark churches – a real witness to the union we share as members of the Body of Christ. I learned so much about what Catholics and Lutherans have in common in the areas of Church, Ministry and Communion. And I grew in appreciation of the human/church history that has unfolded these past 500 years and our ecumenical dialogue that has occurred over the past 50 years. This appreciation of the part that understanding history plays in ecumenism was brought out in the document we utilized, "Declaration on the Way." The document stated several times, "We encourage increased attention to the instruction and formation of the clergy, as well as increased catechesis of the laity, regarding the teachings of their own traditions, and greater knowledge and sympathetic understanding of one another's traditions." As we at St. Denis Church continue to dialogue with and work beside our sisters and brothers at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, may we "always begin from the perspective of unity and not from the point of view of division in order to strengthen what is held in common" so that we can let ourselves "be transformed by the encounter with each other and by mutual witness of faith."

Our St. Denis Youth Group has started off with a great set of meetings. The Youth Group is open to students in High School as well as 8th grade. Our slogan for the year is "Pray like a Champion Today" which is a spin on the Notre Dame Football team sign that all the team members hit on their way to the field. We have had discussions on "what is Church" "why we pray and how do we pray" "what works for you in prayer" leading up to the "teaching Mass" so that our young people can take up the call of God to worship and offer the Mass along with the priest, and not just through the priest. The students who attend have been great to be with. Along with a look at prayer, the teens have been getting to know each other and form a youth group, unique to St. Denis. As a parish, when we were beginning the "Faith in the Future" planning, the Parish Self-Assessment overwhelmingly indicated that we should do things for our youth. So in addition to the great work that the Doves are doing, we have the St. Denis Youth Group. I ask all students, 8th thru High School, to come to our next meeting – see this bulletin for more info about our Youth Group Outreach project!!! I ask all parents to support your child in participating in the life of the parish at their level with their peers in the Youth Group.
